

Constitution

ARTICLE 1: NAME, LOCATION, AND AUTHORITY

SECTION 1. The name of this organization is The Friends of the Falcons First Battalion, located in the Schweinfurt military community, Schweinfurt Federal Republic of Germany. This is a private organization operating in support of 1-77FA.

SECTION 2. This organization will operate in the Schweinfurt military community and within the guidelines set forth by USAREUR, USAG Schweinfurt, and AR 210-22.

SECTION 3. Any amendments will comply with all military regulations governing private organizations operating in the military community and supersede and previous articles or organizations and become effective at the close of the meeting in which they are adopted.

SECTION 4. This organization is established in accordance with AR 210-22 and USAREUR policy. This organization is not an instrumentality of the United States, will be self sustaining, and may not receive financial assistance of the Army or Non-appropriated Funds. Neither the United States Army nor USAREUR nor USAG Schweinfurt nor any other part of the United States Government will assume responsibility for the organization's actions or debts. This organization will not in any way duplicate or compete with non-appropriated funds instrumentality operation or appropriated fund Governmental function.

SECTION 5. All members, in accordance with host nation laws, may be personally liable to creditors, if the assets of the organization are insufficient to discharge all liabilities.

SECTION 6. All members are required to read the Constitution and By-laws upon joining the organization. Members will be required to sign a statement to that effect that they understand the provisions of this section and did in fact read the Constitution and By-laws.

By-Laws

ARTICLE I: DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1: Officers on the end of their term of office will ensure that all organization records are complete including checkbook, financial statements and meeting minutes. These items will be handed off to the new board of officers.

SECTION 2: The organization President will ensure the treasurer maintains the checkbook and financial statements. The Secretary will record all meetings and all rules and regulations are followed. The Treasurer will maintain accurate accounting records, financial statements and ensure all funds are spent in an appropriate manor. The Secretary will maintain accurate records and will record all votes and decisions made by the board of Officers.

ARTICLE II: MEETINGS AND MEMBERSHIP NUMBERS

SECTION 1: Meetings will be held monthly at a location determined by a majority vote of the Officers of the organization. All meetings must be comprised of at least three members of the organization. One of these members must be an Officer of the organization.

SECTION 2: Upon change of an officer and updated list to include full name, address and daytime telephone number will be forwarded to the approval authority.

SECTION 3: A copy of all meeting minutes will be forwarded to the approving authority and be signed by the president.

SECTION 4: All members of the Friends of The Falcons First Organization will be supportive and operate under both the Army Values and the values of the Blackhawk Brigade and the Falcons First Battalion. All members of the organization will have a SOFA status.

ARTICLE III: SPECIAL COMMITTEES

SECTION 1: All special committees will have a list of responsibilities and goals. When a special committee is created a date will be given that the special committee will be dissolved.

ARTICLE IV: EXPENDITURES

SECTION 1: Expenditures will be limited to supporting the Falcons First Battalion and costs of running the private organization will be kept to a minimum.

SECTION 2: Any purchases made to support the Falcons First Battalion will not exceed \$500 per purchase. Any expenditure used for this organization will be used for logistical purposes only. Petty cash will only be held by the treasurer and use must be authorized by the president.

ARTICLE V: INCOME

SECTION 1: This organization will only receive income through fundraisers and donations.

SECTION 2: Any funds used for administrative expenses will not exceed 20 % of money raised during the fund raiser.

SECTION 3: All donations will not be solicited or accepted from any person or entity seeking to do personal business in order to gain monetarily from said business with 1-77FA and it's officers, whether commissioned, non-commissioned or warranted.

ARTICLE VI: FINANCIAL CONTROL

SECTION 1: The account records will be maintained to reflect the assets, liabilities, and financial transactions of the organization.

SECTION 2: Financial statements will be prepared every quarter signed by the president and forwarded to the approving authority. Financial statements will consist of a balance sheet profit and loss statement and fund equity statement.

SECTION 3: If the organization should ever be dissolved all assets and property will be either donated to the soldiers of the Falcons First Battalion or given to a similar organization with similar goals and values.

SECTION 4: All money over 1,000 dollars will be stored at the Community Bank on Ledward Barracks under the account name Friends of the Falcons First (Account Number: 3681426042). All money held on hand will be less than 1,000 dollars and will be insured through AIG Insurance Policy Number D53-20580

SECTION 4: The organization will reimburse the Army for utility expenses unless such use of utilities is incidental.

ARTICLE VII: BONDING

SECTION 1: When the total cash on hand, cash in bank and saleable merchandise to which any elected officer or employee of the organization has access is equal to or greater to \$1000 the organization will purchase fidelity insurance. The Insurance will be procured at the organizations expense from a commercial firm and an amount sufficient to provide full protection of assets.

ARTICLE VIII: AUDIT

SECTION 1: Auditors contracted by private organizations must comply with audit procedures, and requirements in accordance with USAREUR Private Organization and Fundraising Policy.

SECTION 2: Financial statements will be prepared upon change of treasurer as an audit is required upon change of treasurer.

SECTION 3: A corrective action reply will be forwarded to the approving authority within 30 days of an audit.

ARTICLE VIIII: DONATIONS

SECTION 1: A list of all donations made throughout the year will be prepared and forwarded to the approving authority annually.

ARTICLE X: FUNDRAISING

SECTION 1: The organization will not engage in fundraising without approval from the approving authority. All fundraising will be in accordance with the criteria identified in AER 210-22 Section III.

SECTION 2: A letter requesting permission to conduct a fundraising event will be forwarded to the approving authority at least 30 days prior to the event.

SECTION 3: Participation in fundraising activities will be limited to members of the armed forces their family members and members of the civilian component of the US Armed Forces and their family members who are authorized logistical support.

SECTION 4: The organization will submit an AAR to the approving authority within 30 days of the event. The summary will consist of planning execution problems suggestions and distributions of funds.

ARTICLE XI: RESCISSION

SECTION 1: The constitution and By-Laws will be effective immediately after approval of the organization and approving authority.

SECTION 2: Upon approval of the constitution and By-Laws all previous constitutions and By-Laws are rescinded

ARTICLE XII: RESTRICTIONS

SECTION 1: There will be no official relationship between the organization's activities, official duties, and responsibilities of DOD personnel who are organization members and participants.

SECTION 2: The organization will not be created administered or operated by DOD personnel acting in an official capacity.

SECTION 3: This organization will not propagate extremists activities, advocate violence against others, or advocate the violent overthrow of the United States government.

SECTION 4: This organization nor any of its members will seek to deprive individuals of their civil rights

ARTICLE XIII: RATIFICATION

The By-Laws have been approved by a majority vote on 18 August 2008

Unit History

The 1st Battalion, 77th Field Artillery was organized 11 June 1917 as Troops A and B, 19th Cavalry. Their first duty was in support of operations on the southern border against Mexican bandits (thus the cactus at the top of the crest). The unit was reorganized on 11 November 1917 as Battery A, 77th Field Artillery, and was attached to the 4th Infantry Division on 19 November. The battalion distinguished itself during five major campaigns in World War I as part of the 4th Infantry Division signified by five fleur-de-lies on the crest. At the conclusion of hostilities most of the 77th Field Artillery was present at Montfaucon when the Armistice was signed, Thus a Falcon Proper was placed on the Battalion Colors. The unit was inactivated at Camp Lewis, WA on 21 September 1921.

In preparation for World War II, the battalion was activated as Battery A, 634th Field Artillery Battalion at Fort Sill in 1935. As part of the 3rd Infantry Division, the battalion saw action in the Mediterranean campaigns of WWII, including Sicily and Anzio. The unit experienced intense combat from the French Riviera through the Vosages Mountains, and later participated in the final drive into Germany. On 15 May 1945 the unit was redesignated Battery A, 77th Field Artillery Battalion, and was inactivated 4 January 1946 at Camp Kilmer, New Jersey.

The battalion was activated 1 January 1957 at Fort Hood, and after several redesignations, became the 1st Battalion, 77th Field Artillery. 1-77 FA arrived in Vietnam on 13 September 1965 as part of the 1st Cavalry Division. The battalion distinguished itself during action throughout Vietnam. The battalion fought gallantly during bitter fighting in battles west of Plei Me within the Pleiku Province, and for this received the Presidential Unit Citation. 1-77 FA went on to provide fires in the Chu Pong area, Bong Song, and Quang Ngai for the 1st Cavalry Division. In February 1968 the unit fought in support of I Corps during the Tet offensive and fought in Operation Pegasus to liberate the siege at Khe Sanh in April 1968. In November 1968 the battalion was shifted to the III Corps area of Quan Loi. Headquarters and C Batteries received Valorous Unit Awards for action at LZ Grant in April of 1969. Throughout the war the battalion fought with determination, pride, and valor. The battalion was awarded the Vietnamese Gallantry Cross with Palm, and the Valorous Unit Award (FISH HOOK) for their actions.

In April, 1971, 1-77 FA, returned to Fort Hood from Vietnam with the 1st Cavalry Division. The last active element of the battalion, Battery A, 1-77 FA was inactivated in 1995 at Fort Knox, Kentucky. The unit was activated as a Multiple Launch Rocket System Battalion at Fort Sill on 7 June 1996.

In 2001 1-77 FA deployed an MLRS Battery to Kuwait in support of Intrinsic Action and later provided Soldiers to augment the 75th Field Artillery Brigade Headquarters during two deployments to Operation Iraqi Freedom that included the Sensitive Site Exploitation Task Force and the Force Field Artillery Headquarters for the 1st Cavalry Division.

In 2005 the battalion task organized and trained to perform in lieu of missions supporting Operation Iraqi Freedom 05-07, arriving at Camp Arifjan, Kuwait in September and October. The battalion inactivated on 6 March 2007 at Fort Sill Oklahoma.

The battalion was again reactivated in Schweinfurt, Germany as an M109A6 Paladin Self Propelled Howitzer Battalion on March 17th, 2008. The battalion is currently the most modern and lethal artillery battalion in the United States Army, just being fielded with embedded hardware and software to fire the Excalibur GPS guided projectile. The Battalion deployed to Iraq in support of the war on Terrorism in November 2008. They have since then increased the overall efficiency and focus of Iraq tremendously. Falcons First!

LTC Steven Hite

LTC Steven L. Hite, the son of a career Army Officer (and former Redleg) graduated from the University of Arizona with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration and was commissioned through th Reserve Officers' Training Corps in 1988. LTC Hite also holds a Master of Arts degree in Computer Resources and Information Management from Webster University.

After completion of the Field Artillery Officer Basic Course in 1989, LTC Hite was assigned to the 4th Battalion, 3rd Field Artiller "Gunners", 2nd Armored Division (Forward) in Garlstadt Germany. He served as a Company Fire Support Officer, Platoor Fire Direction Officer, Platoon Leader, Special Weapons Officer, and Battalion Fire Support Officer. In 1991, during deployment to combat operations in Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm LTC Hite served as a firing battery platoon leader. In 1992 he wa

assigned to the Testing and Experimentation Command at Fort Sill, Oklahoma and served as a test officer for the Paladin Follow-On Test and Evaluation. Upon graduation from the Field Artillery Advanced Course in 1993, he was assigned as the Assistant S-3 for the 8th Battalion, 8th Field Artillery "Steel" at Camp Stanley and later Camp Hovey in South Korea. In 1994, LTC Hite was assigned to Fort Stewart, Georgia and the 24th Infantry Division as the Battalion (BN) Fire Direction Officer (FDO) for the 3rd Battalion, 41st Field Artillery "Battlekings", later re-flagged as the 1st Battalion, 9th Field Artillery "Battlekings", under the 3rd Infantry Division. In 1996, LTC Hite deployed to Kuwait as the BN FDO in support of Exercise Intrinsic Action. Upon return from deployment, LTC Hite assumed command of Bravo Battery and deployed his battery to the National Training Center two times. In 1998, following Paladin battery command, he was selected to command Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 3rd Infantry Division Artillery where he supported Operation Desert Fox with half of his battery deployed to Kuwait.

In 1999, LTC Hite was assigned to the Battle Command Training Program as an Opposing Forces Operations Officer at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. Upon completion of the Command and General Staff College, he was assigned to Fort Hood, Texas as the 4th Infantry Division's Fires Planner in 2001. In 2002, LTC Hite served as the battalion executive officer for the 4th Battalion, 42nd Field Artillery "Straight Arrows" where he deployed with the battalion for combat operations in Operation Iraqi Freedom. In July 2003, LTC Hite became the Brigade Fire Support Officer for the 1st "Raider" Brigade, 4th Infantry Division in Tikrit, Iraq. Upon redeployment to Fort Hood in 2004, LTC Hite was assigned as the executive officer of the 2nd Battalion, 77th Field Artillery "Steel Warriors", 4th Brigade Combat Team (BCT) as it prepared to activate as a fires battalion as part of a modular BCT.

In 2005, LTC Hite was assigned as an instructor and later as the Officer-In-Charge of the Joint Targeting School in Virginia Beach, Virginia assigned to J7, US Joint Forces Command. On 29 January 2008, LTC Hite took command of 1st Battalion, 7th Field Artillery "First Lightning", 2BCT "Dagger", 1ID. On 17 March 2008, 1-7 FA reflagged to 1st Battalion, 77th Field Artillery "Falcons First" as 2BCT "Dagger", 1ID reflagged to the 172d IN BDE "Blackhawks". On 1 December 2008, 1st Battalion, 77th Field Artillery "Falcons First", deployed with the 172d Infantry Brigade in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. TF 1-77 FA currently has troops serving in three Iraqi provinces.

LTC Hite's awards include the Bronze Star, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal with one bronze Oak Leaf Cluster, the Army Commendation Medal with one silver Oak Leaf Cluster, the Army Achievement Medal with three bronze Oak Leaf Clusters, the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, the Southwest Asia Service Medal, the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary and Service Medals, the Korean Defense Service Medal, and the Kuwait Liberation Medals (Saudi Arabia and Government of Kuwait). LTC Hite also wears the Joint Meritorious Unit Award, the Valorous Unit Award, and the Parachutist Badge.

LTC Hite is married to the former Kathi I. Barrell of Lawton, Oklahoma. They have one daughter, Chelsea (24) and two sons, Geoffrey (11) and Spencer (9).

CSM Chucky Young

CSM Young is a native of Fort Myers, Florida. He completed his basic training at Fort Sill, Oklahoma in September, 1980. His duty assignments include 333rd FA (Lance) Battalion at Camp Peri, Weisbaden, Germany; Bravo Battery Staff & Faculty Battalion at Fort Sill, Oklahoma; 4-27th FA (MLRS) Battalion at Wertheim, Germany; Charlie Battery, 10th FA (MLRS) at Fort Carson, Colorado; Alpha Battery 1-27th FA (MLRS) Battalion at Babenhausen, Germany: 1-77th FA MLRS Battalion at Fort Sill, Oklahoma; Alpha and HHS Batteries, 1-27th FA MLRS Battalion at Babenhausen, Germany; HHB 41st FA Brigade, Babenhausen, Germany; and 1-7th FA Battalion, Schweinfurt, Germany, and is currently serving as the Battalion Command Sergeant Major of the 1-77th Field Artillery Battalion stationed in Schweinfurt Germany.



He has performed duties as Vehicle Driver, Monitor Programmer Operator, Assistant Gunner, Gunner, Firing Section Chief, Platoon Sergeant, First Sergeant, Battalion and Brigade Operations and Intelligence Sergeant/Sergeant Major, and Battalion Command Sergeant Major.
